# irtec - More of what matters

The Institute of the Motor Industry (IMI) secured funding from the UK Commission for Employment and Skills (UKCES) to conduct a study on the return on investment (ROI) of adopting irtec Inspection Technician Accreditation at Morrisons Supermarket vehicle maintenance workshops.

Established by the Institute of Road Transport
Engineers (IRTE), a Professional Sector
of the Society of Operations Engineers (SOE), irtec
is an independent accreditation scheme that
assesses the competence of technicians working
in the commercial vehicle, trailer and passenger
carrying industries. Through irtec, technicians can
add to their qualifications and demonstrate that
their skills and knowledge are up-to-date.
An irtec licence proves a commitment to safety,
competence and demonstrable professional
development by both the technician and employer.

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## Study premise

In June 2012, despite having a 96% MOT first time pass rate, Morrisons agreed to pilot irtec inspection accreditation with two of its workshops and participate in the IMI's ROI programme. John Ward, Head of Morrisons Vehicle Maintenance Unit (VMU), initially looked at irtec after investing in training for fork lift truck technicians and saw a significant increase in technician skill levels and behaviour.

Garth Braithwaite, Engineering Services National Controller for Morrisons, wanted to increase confidence and personal job satisfaction of staff and technicians to lower the risk of stress, a risk factor in a demanding work environment.

Following interviews with the IMI, technicians underwent initial training in October 2012 before undertaking the theory and practical irtec assessments. By January 2013 all technicians had completed their irtec and were interviewed by the IMI to establish changes in behaviour. Morrisons saw and the IMI recorded a positive shift in behaviour, which had positively impacted the efficiency levels and quality of work the technicians were producing.

#### Conclusion

This positive change in behaviour through irtec inspection accreditation, coupled with increased efficiency, led to Morrisons rolling out irtec across all its workshops
